Martin, with help, has managed to get the old Shaft out and thanks to Brian Scott and his Manitou we have a new Oak Trunk ready to be made into a new shaft, something I did not think we would have to do again in my lifetime. Cowbridge Sawmill Waterwheel Shaft Removal

The first action upon identifying the requirement to replace the shaft was to stabilise the pit wheel by supporting it underneath and then bracing it against the building.





Next, all the internal bearing support metalwork and associated wedges holding the wheel to the shaft had to be removed. Not as easy as it looked! Here the shaft is supported by a trolley jack whilst wedges are removed.

On the outside, to gain access to support the water wheel from underneath, we had to pump out the wheel pit, after putting stop logs in place to prevent the pit refilling too quickly.

After supporting the wheel we could remove the outside bearing and its associated metalwork. You can see that this end of the shaft has a flat face. This is because the original bearing cruciform section of the shaft had previously rotted and been removed.





At the same time as removing the outside bearing we had to prevent the wheel from rolling forward. To do this we fixed a wooden brace across the spokes. This was then tied to the steel lifting stanchion above. This stanchion is mounted in the mill wall above the water wheel.

Once all the wedges that had been holding the wheel to the shaft were removed, we were ready to push out the old shaft using jacks, from the outside towards the inside. This was achieved whilst supporting the shaft with a temporary strap and wooden plank.

The old shaft can now be viewed in the mill basement showing the amount of decay present that necessitated its replacement.
